



ASSISTANT/ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF CARDIOPULMONARY SCIENCES

Samford University's School of Health Professions invites applicants interested in serving in a Christian university environment to apply for the position of assistant/associate professor in the Department of Cardiopulmonary Sciences. This tenure-track faculty position is a 12-month appointment and will begin in Summer 2017.

Qualified candidates will be a graduate of a CoARC-accredited respiratory care program and have a minimum of three years of experience as a practicing respiratory therapist. The NBRC registry credential and a current Alabama state respiratory therapy license (or eligibility to obtain a license) are required. In addition, the candidate must have a Ph.D., D.Sc., Sc.D. or other relevant degree. Preference will be given to applicants who have a research doctoral degree (or postgraduate research training), specialty certification (i.e., NBRC, AE-C, RPSGT, CTTS/TTS, CCT) and prior teaching experience in a RC program. The ideal candidate will have clinical expertise in one of the following areas: neonatal, critical care, geriatrics, pulmonary rehabilitation. Experience with online instruction is desirable. A commitment to academic excellence and the ability to work effectively with faculty, students and colleagues is expected. Candidates must be willing to support the Christian mission of Samford University and the College of Health Sciences.

Academic rank, tenure and salary are dependent upon academic qualifications, clinical experiences, previous academic teaching experiences, program management experience and scholarly accomplishments.
