

CoBGRTE Merit Scholarship

Scholarship awards will be based on Academic Achievement, Service, Research Activities, and Awards and Honors. The committee expects to award eight \$500 merit scholarships to CoBGRTE student members of BSRT and MSRT programs.

Submission guidelines: Application materials are due to the Chair of the Scholarship Committee by October 15. Only complete applications will be considered. Applicants are required to submit the following:

Typed Application Form

1. Official transcript verifying GPA and current enrollment in an **undergraduate or graduate** RT program.
2. Current professional resume.
3. One page typed essay that addresses the question of how CoBGRTE can accomplish its goal to increase the number of graduates from baccalaureate and graduate respiratory care educational programs.
4. For the Research Scholarship a research proposal including introduction/literature review, methods and literature citations (this is in lieu of the essay).
5. For Research Scholarship a letter from faculty advisor supporting the feasibility of the research proposal.

CoBGRTE Research Scholarship

One research scholarship will be awarded to support a quality student research project. The committee expects to award one \$1000 research scholarship to a CoBGRTE member enrolled in a graduate program.

Submission guidelines: Application materials are due to the Chair of the Scholarship Committee by October 15. Only complete applications will be considered. Applicants are required to submit the following:

Unfortunately, the merit scholarship application form still lists the one page typed personal statement/essay describing your professional goals and interests related to the profession of Respiratory Care as a requirement (this has been replaced with the essay topic in #3 above).

The merit form still has a section for description of research activities. We left that in the application form, understanding that some graduate students may actually have some activity. We understand that entering students will not likely have any research activity, but that does not preclude them from applying. Other activities will qualify as meritorious (service, academic achievement, leadership).
