We are currently searching for (2) tenure-track faculty positions in the Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Care Program for the 2015-16 academic year. The Respiratory Care Program is housed in the Department of Allied Health and offers a Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Care (BSRC), and Associate Science to BSRC (bridge program).

NKU has a strong commitment to transdisciplinary education and will open a new Health Innovations Center in the fall of 2017. The center will be one of a kind and provide the opportunity for the Department of Allied Health and the faculty to play a significant role in academic innovation as well as impact the health of the region.

Requirements of Candidates

We are seeking a respiratory therapist (eligible for licensure in Kentucky) holding a minimum of a master's degree (doctoral degree preferred), record of teaching and distance education, experience in pediatrics and neonatal respiratory care preferred, and ability to collaborate with faculty in related disciplines. Additional specialty credentials desirable. The successful candidate will teach courses at the undergraduate level to students in both the BSRC Program and the AS to BS bridge program. Additional responsibilities to include: advising and mentoring undergraduate students, scholarship, and service.

Deadline for Application

The formal review of applications will commence on January 15th, 2015, and the search will remain open until the position is filled. The position will begin August 2015.

A complete application will include the following elements: (1) a cover letter that describes how well the applicant satisfies the required and preferred qualifications listed above and how the applicant will specifically contribute to the success of the health science program, (2) statement of teaching philosophy (3) a curriculum vita, (4) unofficial transcripts of all graduate work, and (5) the names of at least three professional references. (For applicants who reach the candidate stage, official transcripts and at least three letters of recommendation will also be required as well as a presentation.)
