Position Description: The University of Toledo is seeking a faculty member for the Respiratory Care Program. Depending upon experience and qualifications, this individual will either assume the position of Program Director or faculty member. Along with other Program faculty, the individual is responsible for achieving Program objectives, goals, and outcomes required for continued CoARC accreditation.

Rank: Open, depending upon qualifications and experience

Term: Nine month tenure-track or clinical

Salary: Determined by qualifications and experience

Starting Date: January or August, 2019

Qualifications (required):

- ◆ RRT credential, Ohio RCP License (or eligible), 4 years experience as RRT with at least 2 years in clinical respiratory care
- ◆ Required terminal degree (PhD, EdD, DO, MD, PharmD) or all but dissertation (ABD) but must have degree completed by time of hire.
- ◆ Area of specialization open
- ◆ Strong desire to carry out publishable research

Qualifications (preferred):

- ◆ Demonstrated record of research publication
- ◆ Record of involvement in either internally and/or externally funded grants
- ◆ Minimum 2 years teaching experience in a CoARC approved Respiratory Care Program

Responsibilities:

- ◆ Teach courses within the curriculum of the Respiratory Care Program
- ◆ Carry out administrative duties for the Program as assigned by Dean, College of Health and Human Services
- ◆ Participate in graduate courses within area of specialization
- ◆ Pursue external grant funding
- ◆ Establish an independent/collaborative research program resulting in presentations at the national level and publications in refereed journals.

Research areas of specialization within the College include High Fidelity Simulation and Interprofessional Education (The University has recently opened a \$35 million, free-standing, high fidelity simulation center),

Other program offerings in the college and University include: Human Performance and Fitness Promotion, Biomechanics, Motor/neuromuscular Control, Athletic Training, Health Promotion, Curriculum Development, Educational Technology, Educational Research and Measurement, Health Care Administration, and Public Health.

Additional research/collaboration opportunities exist at the University of Toledo College of Medicine, including aspects of Pulmonology/pulmonary Rehabilitation. Opportunities for clinical trials are also available in several area hospitals. The University of Toledo emphasizes interdisciplinary, transformational research.

The Respiratory Care Program at the University of Toledo was founded in 1971 and has a distinguished record of continuing accreditation with excellent student outcomes. The Program produces advanced practice Respiratory Care Practitioners for the local area as well as nationally and internationally. Graduates of the Program have advanced into leadership roles in clinical, academic, and professional positions locally and nationally. Normally 20-25 students graduate yearly with a Bachelor of Science in Respiratory Care.
